

SUBJECT: OsteoDenx for Atrial Fibrillation/Pacemaker

Fifteen years ago when we first joined the Nikken family, I thought that magnets were everything. Little did I realize that there are many natural ways to impact the body so that it has the opportunity to heal itself. This last July 16th I went into Virginia Mason Hospital and under the care of a highly respected Cardiologist and had a Pacemaker put into my body. His specialty was Pacemakers. Unfortunately it was not put in correctly and the lead from the Pacemaker came loose perforating my heart, the sack around my heart and one of my lungs. By the time the doctor went back in to correct the problem my blood pressure was so low they could not give me anesthetic during the second procedure. At one point they told me my blood pressure was 50/32. I had bled profusely into the chest cavity.

After the Pacemaker was implanted correctly the lower part of my heart was relying 100% on the Pacemaker for its function. I then developed Atrial Fibrillation and the doctor put me on a medication for that. When Nikken introduced OsteoDenx and I understood that this product allowed the body to utilize Calcium at a higher level and store it into the bones and then release it in a more efficient way so that the whole body is affected. Every function of the body begins with an electrical charge. Thought process, reflex of a muscle, digestion, hormone release -- all begins with an electrical charge. An electrical charge cannot take place without Calcium being present. Once I understood this, my reasoning told me my whole health challenge could be that my heart's electrical mechanisms were not working properly possible due to a lack of Calcium.

I went on to OsteoDenx , and after a short time went off the medication for Atrial Fibrillation. This last time my Pacemaker was checked (This was the 3rd time--once every month since the operation.) it had not recorded ANY Atrial Fibrillation. I asked the technician if it could be possible that my heart could someday heal enough that it would not need the Pacemaker. The answer was NO but she did the test. Previously when she did this test my heart would slow down and gave me the sensation of everything going fuzzy. I felt terrible. This time she asked me "Did you feel that?" I said "No!". She then turned the Pacemaker down even lower and she told me that my heart did kicked in and began to beat on its own. The heart went from using the Pacemaker 100% for the lower ventricle to working largely on its own after using OsteoDenx . I am still on the Pacemaker under the direction of my doctor and the technician but I believe that someday I may not need the Pacemaker. This is exciting and given time I believe my heart can heal completely.

Later, because there was so much blood in the chest cavity, I developed inflammation and was in the hospital for three days. When I was released, the doctor said it could come back and if it did, I was to go back onto the medication. After 8 days on the medication my stomach began to hurt very severely. I stayed on it for the ten days like the doctor prescribed and after going off it, it took about two days more for my stomach to quit hurting. The inflammation did come back a couple of weeks later but this time instead of going back on the medication, I put a Nikken Back flex on my chest and wore it 24/7. It has been 4 months since the original procedure and some of the negative results are still present but THANKS TO NIKKEN I believe that I will have a healthy body again!

UPDATE:

January 2, 2008: It has been over 5 months since the Pacemaker was put in me. I have been going once a month to have it checked. At the end of November of 07 the numbers were: For the Upper Ventricle, the Pacemaker did 15% of the work, and the Lower Ventricle, the Pacemaker was doing 100% of the work for my heart. Just this last Monday, December 31st, the numbers were: upper chamber - 9% and lower chamber - 5% (a 95% improvement)!

The technician was TOTALLY amazed at the figures. She kept saying: "You are never going to believe these numbers; you are never going to believe these numbers". After she told me the figures I then rehearsed what OsteoDenx does, she replied "The proof is in the pudding". I still have had NO Atrial Fibrillation! I am excited to know how close to normal my life can be from this point on, and it is a safe, soft approach to good health.
